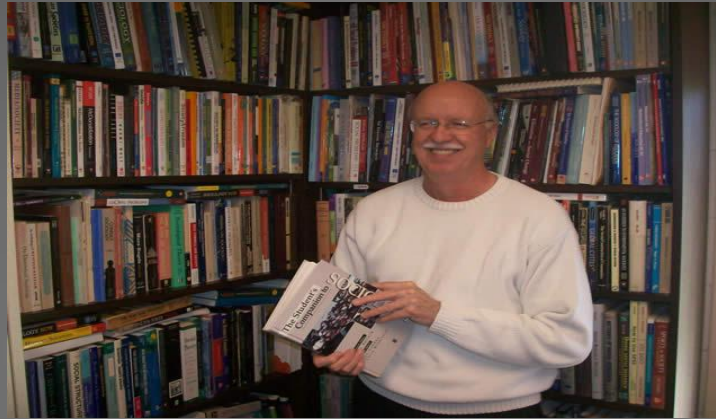

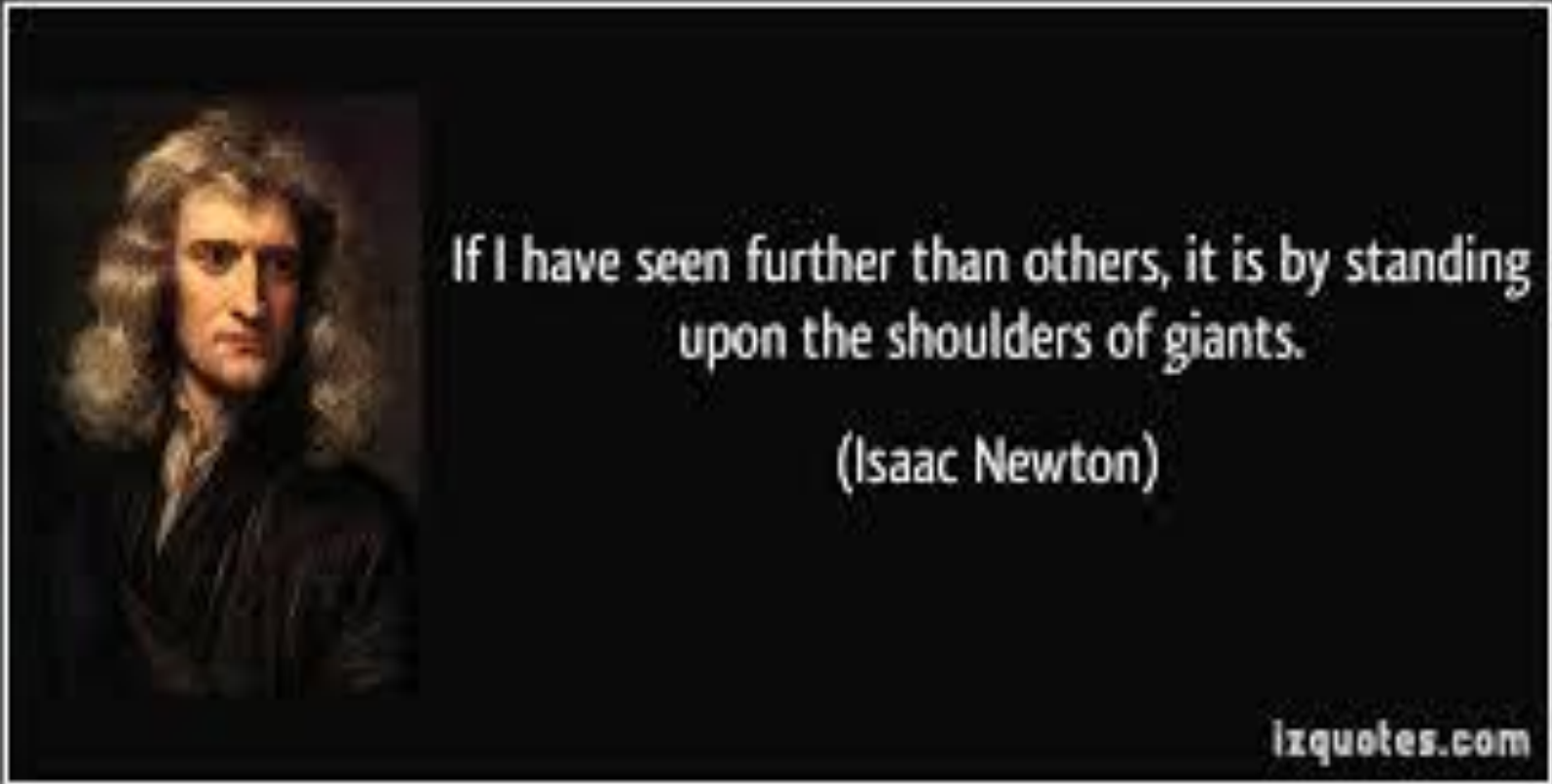
Dr. Anne M. Price

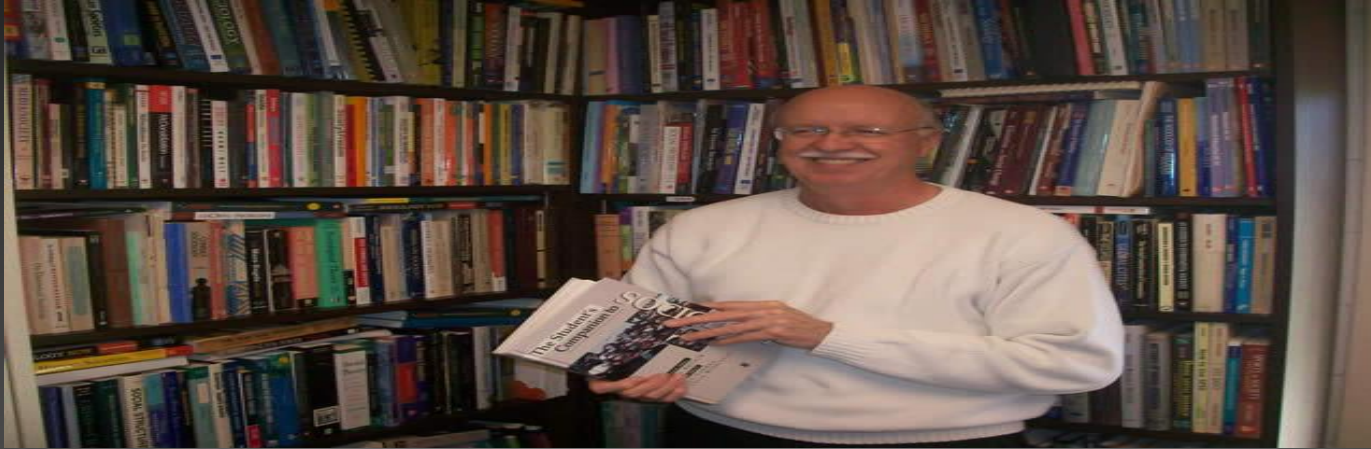
